Ministerial Building	Following public consultation MBS007 was gazetted on 25 July.
Standards MBS 007 and MBS 013	Further feedback received from stakeholders following gazettal led to two amendments to MBS007. The first amendment addresses editorial errors and clarifies some of the requirements. The second amendment clarifies the requirements for lodgement and delays the implementation of the new provisions for alterations and additions to existing buildings until 1 May 2025 to assist industry with the transition.
	Following public consultation, MBS013 is currently being finalised.
	The Building Standard e-newsletter continues to be the main platform for informing our building industry stakeholders of building policy changes, updates and consultations.
	And the building policy webpages on the PlanSA website are continually updated with new information and resources.
Community Engagement Charter Review	Engagement opened on 14 March and closed on 6 June.
	56 submissions were received, with 27 submitted via YourSAy.
	The YourSAy page was visited more than 1.7k times with the majority reaching the site via social media links.
	277 people downloaded documents, with the marked-up charter downloaded 287 times.

	The 'what we heard' summary was sent to all those who submitted feedback and registered to attend an information session, along with the engagement evaluation survey.
	The engagement report and recommendations are currently being finalised
State-wide Bushfire Mapping Code Amendment	Engagement opened on 23 November and the closing date was extended from 8 March to 5 April.
	A total of approximately 190 submissions were received.
	The 'what we heard' report and engagement evaluation survey has been provided to engagement participants and the engagement report is currently being developed.
