## **Expression of Interest – State Commission Assessment Panel**

The State Commission Assessment Panel (SCAP) is established under South Australia's *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* as a committee of the State Planning Commission (the Commission).

SCAP's responsibilities include the following:

- Assess and determine development applications where the Commission is the relevant authority.
- Assess and report on crown development and public infrastructure applications to the Minister for Planning.
- Act as the lodgement authority for all land division applications.

SCAP consists of seven members, who are appointed by the Commission. SCAP membership comprises a Presiding Member, a Deputy Presiding Member and five Ordinary Members. The Commission may also appoint Occasional Members and Commission Members from time-to-time if deemed necessary.

The Commission will seek to ensure that the members of SCAP collectively have qualifications, knowledge, expertise, and experience in the following areas:

- Urban and regional planning, building, engineering, or a related discipline.
- Public administration, including State and Local Government.
- Urban or regional development, commerce, or industry.
- Environmental conservation or management, or the management of natural resources.
- The provision of facilities for the benefit of the community.
- Urban design, building safety or landscaping design.

Each SCAP member is also required by the Commission to be an Accredited Professional (Accredited Professional – Planning Level 2).

Members are appointed for a maximum of three years and are eligible for reappointment. Membership must, as far as practicable, comprise equal numbers of women and men.

The Commission invites Expressions of Interest (EOIs) from suitably qualified individuals to be appointed to SCAP. EOIs for all positions (including the Presiding Member and Deputy Presiding Member) comprising a covering letter of no more than two pages and a curriculum vitae of no more than four pages are invited, and must address the following:

- The candidate's qualifications, knowledge, expertise, and experience (specifically against the requirements above).
- Whether the candidate is seeking appointment as a Presiding Member, Deputy Presiding Member or Ordinary Member.
- Whether the candidate holds accreditation as an Accredited Professional—Planning Level 2.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are encouraged to apply.
